The Vestry at the same time agreed with the Rev<sup>d</sup> William M. Stone to officiate as Minister of Stepney parish and for his services as minister agreed to take such subscriptions as the Vestry could obtain. The Vestry then proceeded to elect a vestryman in the room of William Cottman and on counting the ballots found Capt. Thomas Waters duly elected.

The Vestry then gave a certificate to the Rev<sup>d</sup> William M. Stone of his being duly received as Rector of Stepney Parish to give him a seat in the ensuing Convention and elected George Robertson Esq. and gave him a certificate of the same.

The Vestry then proceeded and took under consideration the Canons and articles of the Episcopal Church to which the Vestry and communicants under the same are requested to subscribe - Saturday June 23-1803. The Vestry of Stepney parish met agreeable to appointment at Dalbury in order to let out the Repairs of the church. When John Dashiell William Russum Jonathan Haller Edward Austin and Henry Handy agreed with James Weatherly to do sundry repairs viz -

All the Windows and doors in the Lower Store to be cased and faced New doors to be made and hung Windows new shutters to be made and hung and the aforesaid Vestry did agree with the afd<sup>r</sup> Weatherly that they would furnish the materials that should be necessary and the Weatherly did agree to do the afd<sup>r</sup> Repairs for Forty five Dollars and the afd<sup>r</sup> Weatherly did further agree to make all the Lash that the Church was deficient of for Paper light and

My dear friends - Remember that you and I both have to stand at the Bar of God to give a strict account of all our Stewardship do my dear friends strive to watch over your flock better I think that if you felt the Love for poor sinners that I do you should watch over them better. Glory to God I know that I have that willingness in my heart that I am Born of God and I am determined through Grace to spend the Rest of my days in the Service of God. Now my Dear friends I cant help but pray for you may God of his infinite power pour down his converting and sanctifying power on you

all and make the place awful on the account of his presence O my God remember the Vestry of Stepney Parish and enable them to watch over their flock better that you and I may meet at the Right hand of God there to shout and wonder at his grace to all Eternity Dear friends pray for me that I may not turn back to the world I can say no more but commit you in the hands of that judge that knows your heart and mine and this from your Loving Communicant in Soul and Spirit.

Sir:

The Vestry of Stepney Parish at a former meeting on examining their communion found that some of that number had withdrawn and connected themselves with other Denominations without offering any reason to their fellow members for so doing, when a Canon of our Church expressly called on the Rector of the Parish to make an annual return of his communicants. How was his duty to be complied with without being furnished with a list by his vestry. And how were the vestry to furnish a list without knowing the persons who composed that communion. To accomplish this the vestry calls on those who had for some considerable time withdrawn themselves, and whom report had said were connected with other societies. To know from themselves whether they had withdrawn or not.

was the object of the former notice.

We state this to shew by what the Vestry were influenced, and as a means to produce conviction on your mind that you have done what you ought not to have done - We will ask you in what other way could we have done it, and we will further ask you if it was not done in the spirit of meekness.... breathed the language of Christian Love. You may alledge was an intimation of Scism, were you a man of information we would enter elaborately into a definition of the term, and shew by authority from the time of St. Paul to the present Day that you are expressly guilty of that crime, we think it unnecessary to quote authority or authorities on this occasion, as you may alledge that it was done to answer this particular purpose, we will therefore to make it conclusive and irresistible, refer you to the Discipline of the Church you now profess on that subject. And ask yourself, if that can be applicable to you in your present situation, without being equally applicable to you in the situation you were in. We will further ask you if you were determined to break through all the social ties humane & Divine by which one man is tied to others, could you not have done it without prostrating, and charging others with crimes the most Black and enormous.

Would nothing short of this do for your justification were we permitted to delineate a line of conduct for you it would have been this, as a member of that church, if you saw drunkards and people of all kinds of fashions, (to make use of your own term) crowding that Communion was it not your duty to have communicated this to the Body, who were authorized to correct those errors. How do you



know, but the previous admonitions were given, and if they did not prove salutary, that compulsory measures would be adopted. Did you go into these enquiries, such an enquiry would have been zeal seasoned with knowledge, but how is it that none of this extraordinary love for sinners ever appeared till a justification was called for.

We well know it is contrary to the Revealed will of God, that the justification of one poor sinner can be Established on the condemnation of others, we are old enough in the world, and sufficiently acquainted with mankind to know, that the lips and hearts of men may be at opposite points, Mankind may make professions of the knowledge of their sins forgiven, and may say they know they are born of God, but the Gospel tells us, "They that commit sin are of the Devil". We wish not to be mistaken in this business, we acknowledge, we feel as men, we also wish to feel as Christians, and we are also bound to feel as the representatives of the Episcopal Church, and as the Guardians of that church we feel bound to support its Dignity upon Christian principals.

We would fain offer our prayers for you. But if we are the Drunkards represented the same scripture that tells us "The prayers of the Righteous avail little much," also tells us "The prayers of the wicked are an abomination". Whatever our opinion of each other may be. This we can confidently say, if you are the Christian in Reality - you profess to be, you will cheerfully meet your offended Brethren, to remove every cause of offence. We feel equally ready to meet you under the command of our Lord and Master, who says, if thy Brother offend forgive

him, (viz when a sense of penitance is manifest)  
 We have been thus lengthily on this subject to convince  
 you of your error and have unanimously consented  
 that the hand of lenity should be extended to you.  
 We therefore inform you that if you will meet the  
 Vestry at Green Hill on the first Monday in March  
 next and there make such concessions as shall  
 be deemed satisfactory to them, so as to remove the  
 defamatory charge exhibited in your reply, you  
 will be treated with as much lenity as the case  
 will admit of. If you do not, you will be  
 excommunicated from the Pulpit in every church  
 in the Parish, and your Letter reserved as a Justifi-  
 cation for our Conduct to posterity.

Loose letter. Mr. George Riall

Dear Sir:-

I thank you for yours of the  
23<sup>th</sup> inst. enclosing the extracts from the Record  
of Stepney Parish. They are important to my  
work. & you have done me a great favour.

I regret that I had no opportunity of examining  
these records during my late visit to the E.  
Shore. There are probably other things in connec-  
tion with the names of Winder, Gilliss, Henry  
Polk, Mutter &c. &c. which would have been of  
value to me.

You give me the name of John Handy who mar-  
ried Ann Mutter with the date of marriage  
Dec<sup>r</sup> 23<sup>th</sup> 1748 & the birth of their son Thomas  
March 18<sup>th</sup> 1749. This would make his birth  
about three months after the marriage. Is  
there not a mistake in your figures? I had  
calculated his birth from other dates in my  
possession (an affidavit given in Sept. 1773 in

7321  
which he says he was 23 yrs. old) in 1730, will  
you be kind enough to examine this again, & inform  
me on the subject. Do you find any other notice  
of this Thomas Handy on the Records? You give  
him a son of Jas & Anne Handy, I suppose of  
course it is John & not Jas. in the Record.

The George Handy whose family Record you  
send was my Great Grandfather. & I am pleased  
to find that the dates correspond with dates which  
I already had in my possession, except in the  
case of Elizabeth which you put down June 8. 1773.  
This Elizabeth was the wife of the late Dr. Saml.  
Key of Princess Anne.

Will you not be kind enough to refer again to the  
Records, & see whether the James Handy you send  
me is not James Hardy, instead of Handy?

There was a James Hardy, but I have found no  
James Handy, living at so early a period in  
Somerset. It is very important to settle this  
question, & you will do me a great favour to  
refer very closely once more to this name. If  
you should find that this was certainly James  
Handy, it would bring a flood of light upon  
my work to get his wife's name also.

The William Handy who married Mary Harries  
I cannot identify, there was a John Harries who  
married a Mary Handy.

I am hunting for a William Handy who married  
Elizabeth Beauchamp, at an early period.

Will you do me the favour to tell me whether you  
find the names of any Handys as Church Wardens,  
vestrymen, or in any other church relationships.

With many thanks for your attention, & hoping it  
may be in my power to serve you at some

future day
